Hazrat Shah Ali Mohila College was established at the heart of Mirpur in the city of Dhaka in 1991. It was named after Hazrat Shah Ali Bagdadi (R), a great religious saint who came from Bagdad and spread Islam in greater Mirpur area. It is a non-government college including MPO. Its land area is 1.67 acre. It is surrounded by boundary wall and three storied market. It has a playing field filled with natural scenes and sights. There is no pond in the

college premises. The college has one four storied building with 40 rooms and another eight storied building with 24 rooms. Its open space is about 1.02 acre. The mission and vision of the college is to make the learners practically skilled and fit for job market and entrepreneurship as well as global citizens by providing them with quality education which is the demand of the modern competitive world.

Background of Hazrat Shah Ali Mohila College:

Hazrat Shah Ali Girls High School was established in 1974 in the eastern side of the Mazar of Hazrat Shah Ali Bagdadi (R). In the southern part of the school, there was an open waste land where temporary bazar and fair took place and hawkers sold their goods. The Managing Committee of Hazrat Shah Ali Girls High School made a petition to the government for that piece of land for upgrading the Girls High School to a college for the downtrodden girls of Mirpur. The members of the Managing Committee were Mr. M A Mazid, Mr. Md Abdul Aowal, Mr. Hosna Afroz, Mr. Sayed Enayet Karim, Mr. Md Abdur Rahman, Mr. Shirin Akter and Hasina Haque. For the heartiest effort of the Managing committee, Hazrat Shah Ali Girls High School then got primary permission to admit HSC first year students and allowed to use the open waste land. As a result, the name of that institution turned into Hazrat Shah Ali Girls High School and College. At first, the college started with Humanities group and then the Science and Business studies groups were opened successfully. Mrs. Shirin Akter, the then Head Mistress of the institute took the responsibility as a principal. Within a few years, the college became a famous one at Mirpur in Dhaka. In 2000, the Managing Committee wanted to upgrade the college into a degree college. So, they applied to the National University for permission. As

per the rules of National University, the administration of school was separated from that of college. Then, the college was upgraded into a degree college. The assistance and cooperation of our local MP and the chairman of that period Mr. Kamal Ahmed Mojumder, will always be remembered with reverence for his outstanding contribution. After that, the Managing Committee of the college opened honours course in 2006. The HSC course was granted MPO in 1994, Degree course in 2001 and BM course in 2010. The HSC Programme under Bangladesh Open University started in this college in 2006 and the BA and BSS programme in 2006. The former MP Dhaka-14 and Chairman of College Governing Body late Aslamul Hoque Aslam has contributed a lot to the development of this institution. Now, the usual activities and gradual development of this college are on the march under the proper guidance and motivation of Mr. Agakhan Mintu, MP, Dhaka-14.

Biography of Hazrat Shah Ali Bagdadi (R.):

Hazrat Shah Ali Bagdadi (R.) was a religious saint. His father Sayeed Fakhruddin Razi lived in Baghdad. He was a great scholar in the Holy Quran and Hadith. Hazrat Shah Ali Baghdadi along with his disciples reached Delhi in 1412 AD when he was twenty years old. Then, he left Delhi and reached Girdah in Faridpur where Jalal Uddin Mohammad Shah granted him a vast area of land of 12000 bigahs. He preached Islam there and then came to Mirpur, Dhaka. Here he became a disciple of the saint Shah Bahar (R). Here, he preached Islam for a long time and died inside the Mirpur Mazar. He came to Mirpur far away from Iraq to preach truth and justice. He is still alive in the heart of the people for his noble deeds. So, it is found that most of the names of school, college, madrashas, markets and business farms are named after his name. Our educational institution is no exception.
